Our Aim

The new 2022/23 Primary School Physical Education Programme will provide an exciting and impacting opportunity for Primary Schools in Stockport and the surrounding area to become a Stockport County Community Trust partner school for the 2022/23 academic year.

The overarching aim of the programme is to engage with primary schools in our community. We aim to give them full access and opportunity to Stockport County through the bespoke programmes we can offer in addition to supporting PE delivery with our experienced team of coaches.

A 2022/23 partner school automatically unlocks all of the fantastic opportunities outlined within our brochure.



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PE Lessons

National Governing Body Level 2 qualified coaches, with experience working in a school setting. We will work with each individual school to create a bespoke package that suits your school, teaching staff and children, to ensure we reach the best outcomes for everyone in line with the National Curriculum. We will offer a multi-sport curriculum which can be adapted to meet the individual needs of each school and class, to make sure there are clear learning outcomes and progression.



Premier League Primary Stars Programme

You will gain access to the nationwide Premier League Primary Stars Programme that is exclusive to football club's affiliated charities. All activities delivered as part of this programme align to the PLPS Values: Be Ambitious, Be Connected, Be Fair, Be Inspiring.

The programme aims are both practical and classroom based in order to use the appeal of the Premier League and Stockport County to inspire children to learn, be active and develop important life skills. Classroom PSHE topics such as resilience, diversity, self-esteem and antibullying are delivered by the team working within the framework of the National Curriculum and the vision and values of the Premier League Primary Stars programme and each specific school. We extend the programme through the delivery of the PLPS extra-curricular clubs which include breakfast, lunchtime, and after-school clubs.



Assessment

We will support the school with both class and individual assessments to ensure targets are being met and children are able to see their own progress in consultation with each class teacher and subject lead.

Using our “whole child” approach to assessments in PE, we can ensure we are meeting the needs of all children, not just through physical skills, but also in cognitive, affective and experience areas also. This enables children to make progress and improve their attainment. This in turn will increase confidence and development across the whole curriculum.

Our assessments use the three gradings of working towards expectations, meeting expectations and exceeding expectations. We use four areas to assess – physical, cognitive, social/affective and experience. These four areas allow us to see the child in a bigger picture than just being able to perform certain physical skills.



Staff Continuous Professional Development

As a partner school the coaching team will also offer both inhouse and external staff continuous professional development sessions. We will ensure that our delivery is sustainable and so that the teachers build confidence and experience in different sports and learn new skills too. On top of your traditional sports, we can also offer sessions on healthy eating, mental wellbeing, leadership and keeping active at home.

School Player Ambassador

You will be allocated a first team Stockport County player who will be your unique school ambassador for the 2022/23 academic year. The aim is to give our schools the opportunity to have access to our players and embed the allocated player as a role model for the children and families of your school. The player will visit your school on a number of occasions throughout the school year. The children will also receive a termly personalised message from your allocated player.



Partner School Assembly Programme

The partner school will have full access to our 'Together Schools Assembly Programme'. The assembly's aim is to help and support children to adopt good behaviours associated with elite sport including healthy eating, regular exercise, and the importance of listening and trying your best. The presentation gives children the chance to meet their favourite County players and ask them questions about the sport as well as providing interesting information about the club and fun, interactive competitions. The youngsters will also enjoy an appearance from Club Mascot Vernon the Bear.



Partner School Family Match Day Opportunities

All partner schools will have the fantastic opportunity to invite every child along and their family to attend a first team Stockport County fixture at Edgeley Park, free of charge, during the season.

The partner school family match day invite offers a unique opportunity and fantastic chance for children, parents, carers and staff at your school to be fully involved in the heart of a Stockport County match day. Experience VIP treatment at your local club and have a great family day out at Edgeley Park.



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Partner Festivals/ Tournaments

All partner schools will be invited to work alongside other schools in a range of competitive festivals and tournaments throughout the year. The competitions will be organised and delivered by the County Community Trust and will offer schools a range of different sports they can take part in. Throughout the academic year every child in the school will have been given the opportunity to represent their school.

County Community Trust Core Values Programme

Partner Schools Football Festival at Edgeley Park

Every partner school would have the opportunity to take part in an end of year celebration festival on the pitch at Edgeley Park. Children would have the fantastic opportunity to play on the pitch whilst their family and friends cheer from the stands! The occasion would be a partner schools' fun day with a number of other activities on offer throughout the day.



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Edgeley Park Ground Tours

Another unique opportunity for all partner schools would be to have full access to Edgeley Park during the day and offer your children the full ground tour experience. The programme will provide a fantastic opportunity for our local children to experience the club's 125-year-old history along with behind-the-scenes access to areas such as the changing room, board room and much more. Every school would be welcomed by having their name displayed on our giant screen ensuring the day is memorable for everyone attending. In addition to this we would also offer the opportunity for your school to have use the ground and stands for events such as assemblies and presentations.



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Safeguarding
